Scared to write a grant? Don't be! We have a simple application process and provide detailed directions and a rubric so you know exactly what we are looking for.

The Foundation for Fort Mill Schools has 4 types of grants, over \$13,000 to award to teachers and administrators for the 2013-2014 school year. Applications are online at www.ffms.org and are due April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2013.

Innovative Classroom Projects Grants: \$750 a piece and we award 15! For projects combining innovation, creativity, educational value, student involvement, and teacher commitment.

TEC Dowling Grant for Technology: \$500 To upgrade technology or software or provide technology training that directly impacts the classroom.

Professional Development Grants: \$250 a piece and we award 2. For professional development, enrichment, and ongoing education.

Principal Project Grant: \$1,000 For projects combining innovation, creativity, educational value, student, staff, or teacher involvement, and principal commitment.

## **Grant Writing Tips:**

~All you need is passion, purpose, and a little know-how~

Before you begin writing a grant, make sure your project is consistent with your organization's mission and objectives. You want the funder to see purpose in your proposal and easily understand why your proposal would be beneficial to your

- organization. Here are some easy tips to help guide your writing: ✓ Organize and communicate your plan. Don't assume the funder knows your
  - ✓ Write clearly and concisely. Succinctness is more important than volume.
  - ✓ Address challenges. Don't avoid talking about them; show how you will overcome them.
  - ✓ Have objectives that can be completed in a reasonable amount of time.
  - ✓ Make your project benefit as many students as possible.
  - ✓ Be specific about what the money will go toward. Show what it is going to pay for.

## **Progress on the Sopwith Camel**

The construction of the replica Sopwith Camel, a WWI combat aircraft, is making progress at Fort Mill and Nation Ford High Schools. Students have been working on building this plane since August 2012 and hope to have it finished by this May. Currently students are being challenged to derive the formula for the curvature of the cowl skins. The engine is almost complete. Project director and pilot, David Griffin, says the students are facing many design challenges but are responding well.

There is still much to be done before this plane can take off. They are still working on the control system, drum brakes, propeller, compass, airspeed indicator, fuel system parts, and various other items.
