- Kristin Swigunski, Springfield Elementary, "Just Right Readers," to use the right text during instruction to suit every child's needs.
- Janet Schneider, Fort Mill Middle, "Busy Bee Craft Club," offering students community

service projects through new craft and hobby techniques that include teamwork, individual creativity, self-satisfaction, helping others, following directions and personal growth.

- Lorie Cafarella, Gold Hill Middle, "Digital Storytelling," combining the art of telling stories with graphics, audio, video animation, digital pictures and Web publishing.
- Kristin Weeks, Springfield Middle School, "Theater Arts Showcase," in which students produce a full-length production including student choreography from different cultures and short dramatic pieces.
- Sheila Reynolds, Fort Mill High, "Playaway Digital Books," a handheld device that plays digital books so students will improve reading skills.
